You may wish to consider a number of issues: what relevant academic, research or practical experience do you have? Why are you applying to this particular programme of study? What areas of study in the subject interest you? One page is usually sufficient, which should be submitted as a separate sheet enclosed with the application.

**Applicants for research and 'research preparation' programmes** (the D.Phil., M.Litt., M.Sc. by research, or M.St. in research methods, including the M.St. Legal Research) should outline their research plans. Up to two pages is normally sufficient (unless a department states otherwise below), which should be submitted as a separate document enclosed with the application.

The amount of detail required will vary between different subject areas, and applicants may wish to seek further advice from their department or faculty before writing their proposal (contact details are given in the prospectus and online). For example, applicants for research programmes in the humanities and social sciences will usually be expected to submit a comparatively well-developed proposal, giving an outline of how they intend to structure and undertake their research, and where possible, a preliminary title for the thesis. In other subjects applicants will simply need to describe the preparatory reading and coursework that has motivated their choice of subject area. Some departments have chosen to offer specific advice to their applicants, which is given below:

**Biochemistry:** Provide a brief indication of the area of your proposed research, from the list on our website. Please also give the names of supervisors, in order of preference, with whom you would like to work (for both please see http://www.bioch.ox.ac.uk/graduate/research areas).

*Chemistry (all sub-departments):* Provide a brief indication of the area of your proposed research. Please also give the names of three supervisors, in order of preference, with whom you would like to work (see www.chem.ox.ac.uk/staff.html for information).

Computing Laboratory: Research students should consult the guidance available on the department's website before completing this form-http://web.comlab.ox.ac.uk/oucl/prospective/dphil/requirements.pdf

*Earth Sciences:* You should give a brief indication of the area in which you wish to carry out research. This may be quite specific, but need not be if you have yet to develop such a proposal.

**Experimental Psychology:** Applicants for the **M.Sc. Research Methods in Psychology** should provide a statement of no more than 1000 words of their reasons for taking this course and their aims after completing it.

*Life Sciences Interface Doctoral Training Centre:* You are expected to provide a 1000-word essay on how you believe your background and experience would relate to one of the application areas (Bioinformatics; Bionanotechnology; and Medical Imaging).

In no more than 400 words, outline your research interests and indicate clearly how these relate to the projects you have listed (please note that the Department does *not* require applicants to submit a two-page research plan).

*Mathematics:* 1. Please provide details of the area within Mathematics in which you wish to conduct your research, along with a brief statement of purpose. A detailed research proposal is not required.

**Physics (all sub-departments):** please contact the department in which you wish to work well in advance of application. **Condensed Matter Physics** applicants are asked for a brief indication of the area in which you wish to carry out research. This may be quite specific, but need not be if you have yet to develop such a proposal.

*Systems Biology Doctoral Training Centre:* You should provide a 1000-word essay on how you believe your background/experience would relate to one of the four research themes (Bacterial sensory networks; Regulation of CDK pathways; Cellular Hypoxia; and Physiome modelling).
